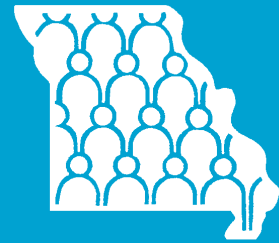


Missouri Census Update



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Census 2000 data by Missouri school district

The Geographic Resources Center, a coordinating member of the Missouri Census Data Center, matched census blocks to school district boundaries in the state to make the presentation of Census 2000 information for Missouri school districts possible. Demographic profiles for school districts and 1990-2000 trend data can be accessed on the MCDC homepage at: <http://mcdc.missouri.edu>.

Out of more than 500 public school districts in the state, only nine serve a population of over 100,000 (total population living in the district, not just students): St. Louis City, Kansas City, Springfield, Parkway, Hazelwood, North Kansas City, Columbia, Rock-

wood, and Francis Howell school districts.

Two school districts in the state have more than half of households in the district with at least one person under age 18—Knob Noster R-VIII, in Johnson County and Waynesville R-VI, near Fort Leonard Wood in Pulaski County. The percent of households with individuals under 18 ranges from a district low of 17.1 percent to a district high of 51.9 percent.

Census 2000 population figures by age for Missouri public school districts are published on page four. This information (even single-year-of-age data) is also available from Census 2000 for counties, towns, census tracts, and other geographies.

Preschool and school-age population figures are used by school district administrators to project future needs for number of classrooms and teachers, by library staff to budget and plan activities and services for children and youth, and by people who are exploring the feasibility of opening a pre-school facility in a particular area.

Select "school data/statistics" for school accreditation status, attendance figures, graduation rates and analysis, dropout information, average teacher and administrator salary, percent faculty with a master's degree or higher, student test performance, and school finance data which includes percent eligible for free or reduced lunches. Five-year trends are displayed for many of these categories.

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Post-Census 2000 population estimates show Missouri continues to grow

July 1, 2001, estimates of the total resident population of states were released in December 2001 by the U.S. Census Bureau. The estimates were prepared in conjunction with the Federal-State Cooperative Program, a collaboration between the Census Bureau's Population Division and the states. Missouri's governor-designated member of the cooperative is the state demographer in the Office of Administration, a coordinating group member of the Missouri Census Data Center Program.

Population changes in the nation since Census 2000 show rapid growth continuing in the West and South. Nevada led all states in growth, with an increase of 5.4% between the April 1, 2000 (census date) and July 1, 2001 (estimate date). Iowa, Louisiana, North Dakota, West Virginia, and the District of Columbia all lost population.

Missouri experienced an estimated growth of 34,496 persons, bringing the total population for the state to 5,629,707. This represents a growth rate of 0.6%—half the national

growth rate. Domestic and international migration growth accounted for only a fourth of the state's growth. Natural growth (resident births minus deaths) accounted for the rest.

The state estimates are actually summed county estimates, which are controlled to an independently derived national estimate. July 1, 2001, county estimates are expected to be released by May 2002.

The methodology used to estimate national, state, and county populations is essentially a component change approach, where independent estimates of change due to births, deaths, net domestic migration, net international migration, and change in group quarters populations (e.g., persons in college dormitories, military barracks, prisons) are added to the Census 2000 population base. The methodology incorporates separate treatments for the household population and for the under 65 and over 64 populations.

Introducing Missouri Census Data Center's interactive map server

Census data provides the most comprehensive demographic information available. Along with its comprehensive nature comes the ability to access census information in many different—but equally effective—formats. Tables and maps provide valuable ways to convey large amounts of data available from Census 2000. The particular benefit of mapping is that it associates census data with geographic areas.

To support electronic mapping of census data, the Missouri Census Data Center (MCDC) created an Internet map server for online mapping. This new tool enables users

who may not be familiar with Geographic Information Systems (GIS) to select data categories and create visual representations of census data held by the Missouri Census Data Center. In short, the MCDC Internet Map Server provides a map based upon a chosen type of data from Census 2000. Users can select variables such as general population characteristics, age, race, Hispanic origin, household characteristics, group quarters, and housing occupancy. These variables are mapped at the census block-group level of geography and are displayed for the whole state. It is important to note that many features of this mapping service are only avail-

able if the user “interacts” with the map. For example, it is only by zooming in that more features (e.g., towns, highways, rivers, lakes, streets, tract boundaries, and block group boundaries) appear. In addition to standard census geographies, new legislative boundaries have been added to the interactive map collection.

New legislative district maps and data now available

The Missouri Appellate Apportionment Commission filed post-Census 2000 state senate and house district maps with the Missouri Secretary of State on December 13, 2001. The new state legislative districts take effect in the 2002 primary and general elections. The first state senators and state representatives to represent the new geographic areas will be sworn into office in January 2003.

State demographer Ryan Burson, a Missouri Census Data Center core group member, provided staff support for the Appellate Commission and announced that special color 36" x 42" maps for individual districts are now available for purchase at the University of Missouri's Geographic Resources Center (573-882-1404) or for viewing on Secretary of State's website at <http://www.sos.state.mo.us>. The maps show counties, townships, cities, highways, streets, water, and


other geographic features.

In conjunction with the introduction of the maps, the Missouri Census Data Center has created a new Web-based product for Missouri legislative districts now available online at <http://mcdc2.missouri.edu/maps/2000abstract>. The site includes demographic profiles and charts plus

boundary, dot density, and thematic maps for post-Census 2000 legislative districts.

The center used the official list of Census 2000 blocks, provided by the Redistricting Office in the Missouri Office of Administration, to build demographic profiles and trend reports for each legislative district.

Census Update 

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What is the C2SS?

The Census 2000 Supplemental Survey (C2SS) was a part of the Census Bureau's work during the busy year of 2000, but it is not official Census 2000 data. Rather, the C2SS was designed as a decennial census program to demonstrate the feasibility of collecting information like the long-form data at the same time, but separate from the decennial census. Based on 12 monthly samples, C2SS will provide a benchmark for the Census Bureau's new American Community Survey (ACS) Program. The ACS is a large annual survey being phased in over the next several years. It will provide updated census information throughout the decade, even detailed data for the smallest towns—the type of information which in the past has only been available from long-form census questions asked every 10 years.

Pending congressional funding,

full implementation of the ACS is planned for 2003. The survey will collect data from a sample of three million households each year. Sam-

ple households will be located in every U.S. county, American Indian and Native Alaskan area, as well as Puerto Rico.

Sample of data for Missouri from both Census 2000 and C2SS

C2SS data are limited to the household population and do not include the number of people who live in institutions, college dormitories, and other group quarters.
